This was to ensure that there was a balance between students being prepared and being able to have an opportunity to take the class. Because this is an intro class the prerequisite should be consistent with other intro classes. Mr. Jegede wanted to note that ENC 1101 may not fully prepare the students for this class. Dr. Erle would like the Faculty Senate to start reviewing and developing AA with emphasis taking into account the new Core and submit edits on existing if needed. Mr.Harris suggested that each department should focus on the development of any new AA with emphasis related to their areas. Please refer to the documents sent via email on 1/7/15. (6A-14.065 Meta major pathway.doc and NFCC GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES.docx)

NFCC currently has 3 in place. Please refer to the catalog pages 76-78. There is also a site from FSU (www.academic-guide.fsu.edu) that displays the map for each major. This could be used as a starting point for the

discussion. Proposals could be generated from academic area workgroups which would then be submitted to Senate in Feb, then to Academic Affairs. The department chairs will be contacted to pursue this within the departments. The AA with emphasis should be general in nature. Diplomas will reflect any emphasis. This will help and guide students in choosing classes to take. It was suggested that possible career paths could be listed to help students determine the appropriate emphasis. The deadline is March but discussions and initial submissions should be done by the February meeting. Please share any good resources with all faculty as research is done.
